Weekend Overview

OHF, in partnership with the North Carolina Central University Music Department, is proud to sponsor a three-day music workshop weekend *“bridging the gap between the gospel and classical worlds”* with special guest clinician, Rev. Raymond Wise, Ph.D.

The weekend workshop is open to individuals, choirs, worship teams, etc. who wish to experience the vast knowledge of Dr. Wise’s musical expertise. This jam-packed inspirational weekend will explore areas such as praise and worship, physical expression and rhythmic technique, vocal warm-up, listening skills and music history. Participants will learn repertoire inclusive of spirituals, traditional, inspirational and contemporary gospel. Participants will also share in the workshop showcase, a unity concert that will culminate this amazing three-day journey.

Cost of the weekend workshop is \$100 for adults and \$50 for children (under age 15) The weekend begins on at 6:00PM on Friday, October 1, and culminates with the Unity Concert at 4:00PM on Sunday, October 3. Workshops/rehearsal sessions (with exception of OHF member workshop) will be held in the Edwards Music Building Recital Hall, and the concert will be held at BN Duke Auditorium. Both facilities are located on NCCU’s campus at the corner of Lawson and Fayetteville Streets.

The workshop registration deadline is Monday September 27, 2010. Please complete the enclosed registration form and submit with your deposit of \$25 per registrant to be received no later than the 27th. Workshop balances must be paid prior to the beginning of the workshop on Friday, October 1.

The OHF Music Workshops

OHF Workshops acknowledges music in general as being a viable vehicle to energize people and give birth to new expressions of community because it has a way of reaching deep into the hearts and minds of all people. OHF has specifically selected African American spirituals and gospel music as the genre to convey its message because historically, this music has always inspired hope and peace for the future. The music workshop creates an atmosphere, which strives to unite the contending peoples of the world through the process of coming together to learn and sing this sacred music.

OHF Community Workshop Choirs

The OHF Community Workshop Choir, our most popular program, is an ongoing experience that allows members to systematically develop bonds of friendship across racial, religious, cultural, age, gender and socio-economic lines. Music being the primary bond, our workshop choirs continue to build pockets of unity through regular meetings, rehearsals and performances in their local areas.

Currently there are 3 established OHF Workshop choirs in the United States and 3 in Canada. It is the

Guest clinician, the Rev. Raymond Wise, Ph.D., is a native of Baltimore MD, currently residing near Columbus, Ohio. He has a musical career that has been broad and productive. He has directed more than 30 choirs, and has prepared choirs to perform for national recording artists such as Kenny Rogers, Diana Ross, Yolanda Adams, Tramaine Hawkins, and many more.



As a composer, Dr. Wise has penned more than 500 compositions that have been performed and recorded by local, national and International artists. In addition to his musical proficiency, Dr. Raymond Wise has danced in the form of ballet, jazz, modern, tap, African, ethnic, and experimental to name a few.

Dr. Wise has developed and implemented courses in African-American Gospel Music and Spirituals at several universities within Ohio. He presently instructs courses in Gospel Music and conducts Gospel ensembles at The Ohio State University, Denison University, Trinity Lutheran Seminary, and the Columbus School for Girls. His knowledge of both the gospel and classical music genre has enabled him to serve as a consultant and clinician in academic and gospel music settings across the nation and abroad. This has enabled him to bridge the musical gap between the gospel and classical worlds. Rev. Wise established “The Center For The Gospel Arts” in 1989 to provide educational training for gospel artists and the community. He has developed specialized curriculums in the gospel arts and texts for this school, which offers 30+ classes per week, and has served over 5000 since its opening.
